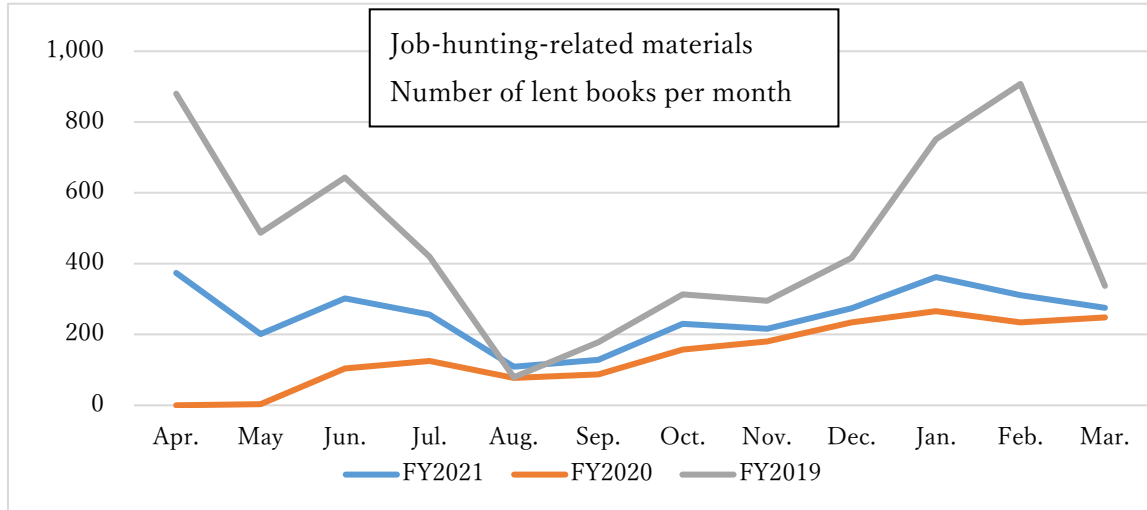


2.2 Coordination with other sections

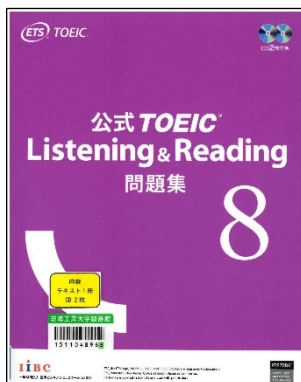
