

3) Free distribution of disposal materials

- In order to promote effective use of SIT's literature property, the sixth free distribution event was held in the library of the two campuses.
- In addition to the disposal materials in FY2023, 4,159 books were exhibited, and 1,609 books were utilized (break down: Toyosu 894, Omiya 715).
- The library satisfaction survey conducted from September to October shows that the recognition of the event is increasing year by year and the rate of use as an SDGs-related event is also increasing.

- The number of volumes at the end of FY2023 is as follows.




Library Collections

“Repair work reports of National Treasure and Important Cultural Property building” Collection
Holdings: approx. 2,200 books.

“Railway” Collection
Including history and photographs, both national and international. Holdings: approx. 4,000 books.

“Company /School History” Collection
Company and school histories are available, including those of popular employers. Holdings: approx. 1,200 books.



Why are they in the library ??

In the early 1990s, a professor from SIT who researched important cultural property buildings retired and donated his work to the library to help students learn about architecture.

He also registered with the Agency for Cultural Affairs and even changed his name to the library upon retirement. The library receives about 20 books a year on important cultural property repair from the organization in charge, via the Agency for Cultural Affairs.
