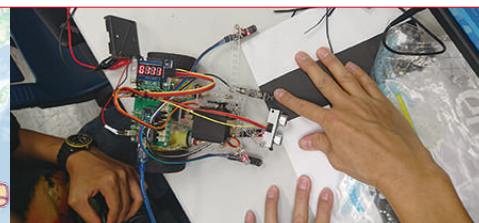


## 01. World's Libraries (Hong Kong)

Project-based learning for the Department of Electronic Engineering was held in the Chinese University of Hong Kong in September. The purpose of the program was to build a robot collecting balls from a field using the "Arduino" microcomputer. The Chinese University of Hong Kong is in 12th place of the QS (Quacquarelli Symonds; a British evaluation organization for higher education) rankings and well known as one of the best Universities in Hong Kong. The total area is 137.3 hectares, which means it is more than 29 times as large as the Tokyo Dome. The hilltop campus has clear views of Tolo bay. "It is huge with lots of hilly streets and stairs," a student who attend the PBL said. There are 7 libraries including a special library in the campus.



## GPBL

Global Project Based Learning (GPBL) is an active learning program, making project teams consisting of both Japanese and local students of the two universities in an academic exchange agreement, working together on tasks depending on their specialty.



Materials on the history of the university are exhibited permanently in the biggest library of the university. It is popular among students as "it makes us feel affection for our university."

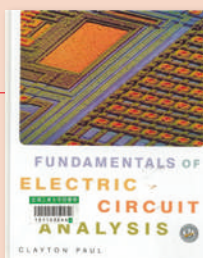

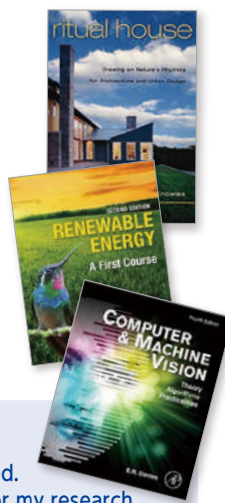
### We had the Ebook garden!
