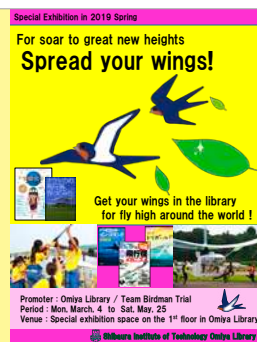
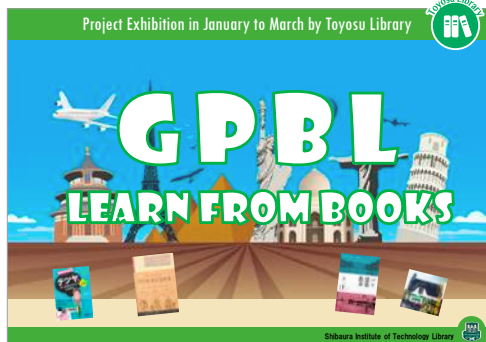
I will study English harder and would like to communicate fluently in English.
