Search, Discover, and Make the Most of It!

Let's make a full use of library services



Want to use the library smarter and more efficiently? Library resources are indispensable for learning and research. By using the library system, you can smoothly handle everything from searching and reserving to managing references. This issue introduces how to use the online catalog system "OPAC"

and the personal service "My Library."

More convenient! Six ways to use library OPAC

The "Collection Search" allows you to search SIT's master's theses as well as valuable and specialized materials such as repair work reports of national treasures and important cultural properties.

lust click on the "New Arrivals" link on the OPAC top page, you'll see a list of newly arrived books. If there is a book you want to read, you can reserve it, too.

You can also search major national databases. With just one search, you can access the materials you need without switching to an external information source.



Use the literature management tool "RefWorks," which makes information gathering easier by allowing you to import literature data directly from OPAC and databases.

> Some of the documents displayed in the search results list have a table of contents and an introduction to the contents.

Browse books with similar content by viewing their cover images.

When searching with Kanji, even a slight typo can cause your search to fail. If you're unsure, try entering the term in hiragana instead.

Scroll down.

When using OPAC on a smartphone, try scrolling down the screen.

Information such as shelf location and table of contents will appear.

Since the display differs slightly between PC and mobile, please make sure to scroll and check carefully!

Easy & Convenient Personal Service: "My Library"

My Library is a personal-use service where you can check loan status, view loan records, and make reservations and renewals. Simple login is available with user authentication (SSO: Single Sign-On).

You can also request materials from other campus libraries or suggest new purchases.

If the material you need is not available on campus, you can request interlibrary loans or copies (photocopies) from other universities.

Alongside various electronic craft works including robots, the exhibit




